SCIENCE NEWS

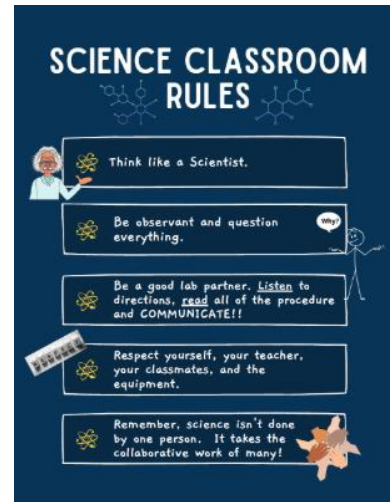
FROM THE SCIENCE ROOM

Welcome back to a new year and an exciting new specialist subject at St Mary's! I am thrilled to be the Science teacher and working with all of our wonderful students. We are extremely lucky to have our new classroom space in the Creative Hub, which is already becoming a very popular place to be.

This year at St Mary's, all classes will have Science as a specialist subject each week, right across the school year.

This term, our focus is on Chemical Sciences, with students exploring the following topics:

- **Foundation:** What things are made of
- **Year 1:** Materials and changes
- **Year 2:** Materials and their purpose
- **Year 3:** Heat
- **Year 4:** Properties of materials
- **Year 5/6:** States of matter



We've had a fantastic first week of lessons—nothing too experimental just yet! Students have learned the expectations of working in the science space, set up their workbooks, and discussed the topics they'll be exploring throughout the term.

The cooler weather has made our first full week back at school very pleasant and we'd like to welcome all new Foundation families and new families to our school. We'd especially like to welcome Lachlan Porcellato (Year 1CD) and Tanner Hinton (Year 2JH) to school. We also welcome Mrs Millar and Miss Richardson to the JLC team this year. We hope you have all had a wonderful summer holiday break and we've loved seeing the students so keen and ready for school.

FOUNDATION



How we put our belongings away, lining up for flag raising ceremony and sitting in class listening to Mr Corcoran.



Our Foundation students are settling in well and showing growing confidence each day. Routines and expectations are going well, and the class is moving more smoothly between activities.

What we've been learning...

Reading (InitialLit):

- We are learning that words are made from sounds and letters.

Writing (InitialWrite):

- We are building strong hands for writing and practising the correct pencil grip.

Maths (Ochre):

- We are building number sense through counting, matching, sorting, and making patterns.
- We are using hands-on activities to help children explain their thinking and notice patterns.

Inquiry / RE:

- We have been doing "All About Me" activities to help children share and learn about each other.
- Our class story this week was *How to Catch a Star* by Oliver Jeffers.

Routines we're reinforcing:

- **Arrivals and unpacking:** bags away first, then lunchbox, drink bottle, and hat into their zone.
- **Mat listening:** eyes watching, ears listening, and hands still so everyone can learn together.
- **Attention signals:** we are practising our class signals and quick responses to "stop, look, and listen".
- **Pack-up:** tidy the space, pack bags carefully, and line up calmly when called.
- **Kind words and hands:** gentle hands, friendly words, and using words to solve small problems.
- **Asking for help:** have a go first, then put a hand up and wait patiently.

Wellbeing and friendships:

- We are practising taking turns, sharing equipment, and including others in play.
- We are encouraging children to try again when something feels tricky or doesn't work first time.
- We are building independence with simple jobs like opening lunchboxes and managing belongings.

Special moments and school life:

- On Monday mornings we join **flag raising** and sing the **national anthem**, with Foundation lined up in the front row.
- We hope everyone had a chance for a photo at the **first day of school backdrop**—it looked fantastic.
- Wednesday is our **rest day**, giving children a gentler mid-week pace.
- Students have done a great job completing our baseline screeners—top effort.

How families can help at home:

- Practise opening lunchboxes and drink bottles so recess and lunch feel easier.
- Talk through the morning routine: bag away, then lunchbox, bottle, and hat in the right place.
- Encourage your child to pause and listen when you use a simple attention signal at home.

Reminders for next week

- **Blue library bag to be brought to school each day and taken home each day.**
- **Hats are required in Term 1** and will stay at school once they are here.
- Please send a **labelled drink bottle** every day.
- Let us know of any **start/finish changes** (pick-up, bus, or after-school care) in the morning.

Tiredness and big emotions after school are very normal at this time of year. As routines become familiar, most children settle more each week.

YEAR 1CD

What an amazing transition from foundation to Year One! We have all stepped into Year One without a worry in the world!

LITERACY AND MATHEMATICS

This week we began our literacy sessions, learning about syllables and revising the sounds we already know. We have begun discussing our storybook that will feature in our weekly storybook lessons. The title is 'Fang Fang's Chinese New Year' which is fitting as we are learning about Geography (Places) and the celebrations held in these places that are special.

Miss Richardson has started doing screeners on all the Year One students to determine who will be in her intervention groups and how the groups will be structured.

In Mathematics, we have done some revision and will be working on number lines from 0 – 20 with a particular focus on number formation. Students will be doing theory components in maths and then doing some hands-on activities. Our next learning point will be on ‘tallying’.

In Inquiry, we read the story ‘Tiddalik’ to tune the students into the theme of ‘natural places’. We discussed elements of geography that were in the story and why the frog had to put water into the water holes where he lived. Students have begun working on a project for this story.

Thank you for the lovely photos of your children during the holidays. We have had lots of fun in the summer break! Congratulations to Eloise Fitzpatrick who was chosen to flip the coin for the Australian Open Tennis in Melbourne. Finally, a big congratulations to Levi Gottschling on the birth of his baby sister Lottie. She had her first visit to school yesterday!



YEAR 2JH

The students have settled beautifully into Year 2 and we have started back into our school routines. The overview of our literacy and mathematics lessons this week is as follows:

Literacy and Mathematics

Our InitialLit2 lessons have started with literacy and this week our focus has been:

Reading: Information Texts

Spelling: ai / ay (ai in the middle of words and ay at the end of words)

Grammar: Nouns

Storybook: Willy the Wimp by Anthony Browne

Maths: Place Value – 2 and 3 digit numbers

Inquiry: Geography – The aim is to help students learn about places outside their own community. They will look at how people and places are connected in Australia and around the world, and how technology affects everyday life.

We have also started with some testing of spelling, writing and will continue other literacy testing next week.

We are excited about sharing the year ahead with you all.

Welcome to the Senior Learning Community for 2026. We start the year with school camp in Canberra, NAPLAN for Year 5's, Care Boxes and our Year 6 students will learn what it is like to be a buddy. Congratulations to our students who have settled into routines well and are ready to work and learn.

CARE BOXES

Your child may have talked about Care Boxes. This is an activity that we would like the students to participate in to help others. As you are aware, there are schools and communities that have been greatly impacted by the fires this summer. We would like to be able to shine a bit of joy on challenging times for the children and families in these areas. Not only in our prayers but also in our deeds, we carry out our charism, In Deeds Not Words, where the students will give a care box for someone who needs it.

The children will use a shoe box and decorate it according to who they are thinking about. Boxes can be for AFL fans, expectant families, toddlers, kindergarten children, 9 to 12-year-old boys and girls, grandparents or families with pets. Items in the boxes could be gardening items for a parent, fidget toys, sports socks, matchbox cars, textas, downball, or books?

We will do this in class, but students can take them home to work on them. The students then place their items in the box along with a personal letter. This project works best if the students buy or get items from their own money. Nothing big, the Reject Shop is a great spot, giving up something (zooper dooper money on Fridays and use that money) and they will be delivered to and community or school organised by the school leadership.

ASSEMBLY AND FLAG RAISING

The Year 6 students will carry out a flag raising and morning welcome on Monday mornings at 8:55am. The students were shown the correct way to raise the flags, how to treat the flag with respect and how we will welcome the week. Thank you to Heidi Barry who volunteered to be our first leader to read The Acknowledgement of Country, Nano Nagle statement and the school prayer. Thank you to Jasper Noble and Max Dittko who volunteered to be our first flag raisers. These students will also be our assembly presenters on Friday afternoon.



CANBERRA CAMP

This year we head off to Canberra on Tuesday 24th, Wednesday 25th and Thursday 26th . Permission forms and details are available on PAM. A note will be sent home with the itinerary and a packing list. Please make sure medical information is up to date. We will be covering the many facets of democracy in class and discussing the emotions that many students may be experiencing. Please complete this task as soon as possible.

LITERACY

Students will be reading War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. Throughout the unit, they will examine key narrative writing techniques, explore vocabulary connected to the historical period of the novel, and develop their oral language skills.

MATH

Over the next two weeks, we will be working on interpreting and creating dot plots and line graphs. This will include calculating the mode and identifying the shape of a data distribution.

RELIGION

This term we will work through two units. We will start with Who Is Jesus in The Gospels? Students will explore the Gospels and explore the ways each Gospel is written from a different perspective, exploring the ways Jesus carried out his ministry.

On Christmas Eve in 1775, in the city of Cork, Nano Nagle and her three companions — Mary Ann Collins, Mary Fouhy, and Elizabeth Burke — founded a small religious community in response to God’s call. Together, they committed themselves as consecrated women, dedicated to bringing the light of hope to “a people who walked in darkness.”

What began as a humble act of courage and faith has grown into a worldwide mission of compassion, education, and service.

The **Year of Celebration in Honour of the 250th Anniversary** will run from **24th December 2025 to 24th December 2026**. Throughout this year, we look forward to remembering their legacy, honouring their vision, and renewing our commitment to carrying Nano’s light into the future.


