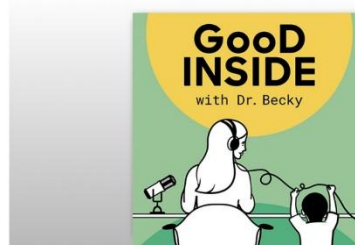

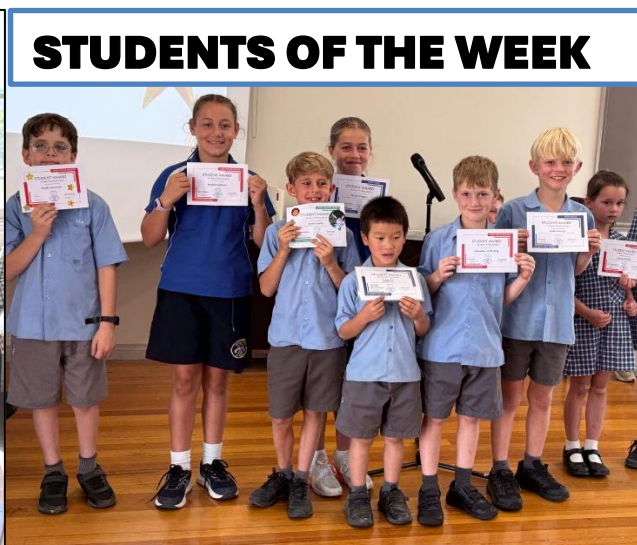
How Do I Handle Screen Time With My Kids? Good Inside

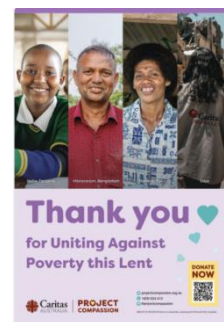

Dear Families,

Thank you to all our Junior Learning Community families for joining us at our first Learning Expo for the year. It was wonderful to see such a strong turnout, and the students were absolutely thrilled to share their achievements from across the term. Their pride was unmistakable, and your support made the event even more special.

As we head into the Easter break and holiday period, we wish you and your families a safe, restful, and joy-filled time together. We look forward to welcoming everyone back refreshed for another great term of learning.

FOUNDATION

It is hard to believe we are already at the end of Term 1. The students have had a wonderful start to their Foundation year and have made a very positive beginning to school life. They are becoming more confident with routines, settling well into learning, and should feel very proud of all they have achieved so far. It has been a great term, and the class is on track with their learning as we head towards Easter and the school holidays.

LITERACY

In Literacy, the students have been learning their Set 1 letter sounds and names. So far, we have learned m, s, t and a, and the children have been building confidence in recognising these letters and saying their sounds. We have also begun learning how to use this letter-sound knowledge to help read simple words. This is an important early step in reading and takes time, practice and encouragement as children continue developing confidence.

MATHS

In Maths, we have been focusing on early number skills. The students have been learning to count to ten and back, count collections to five and ten, represent numbers 0–5 on a five-frame, and match collections to numerals. We have also been comparing collections, exploring “one more”, reading and writing numerals 0–5, and practising subitising collections to five. The class has worked very well in this area and is building a strong foundation in number.

HOLIDAY PRACTICE

Over the holidays, a little bit of simple practice will be helpful. Revising the letter sounds and names we have learned so far (m, s, t, a), having a go at reading simple words, and practising counting to 10 and back will all support the children well. You might also like to count small groups of objects at home, match collections to numbers, and practise recognising and writing numerals 0–5. It would also be helpful for the children to practise writing the focus letters with correct letter formation and having a go at writing their name. Short, positive practice is plenty and helps build confidence.



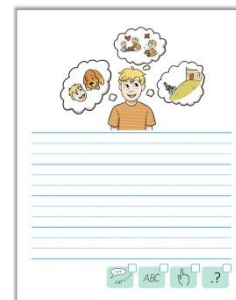
END OF TERM

YEAR 1- LITERACY HOLIDAY IDEAS

Students now know how to write sentences using a capital letter, a full stop or a question mark, spacing between the words and how to read to check for meaning. They have been using dotted third paper in their workbooks and know to write on the baseline and form their letters correctly on the dotted lines. If you are wanting to do some work on the holidays, this is a perfect activity for you and your child to do.



Your child has been practising reading with fluency. When you read with your child, they should not be sounding out every individual sound of every word. If this is the case, the text is too hard for them to practise fluency. In foundation we learned to sound out words, now we need to learn to read the words smoothly with a regular pace. In class we set a timer and see how much of a text we can read in a minute and then we try and beat our personal best by reading the same text the following day. We also have Decodable Readers Australia back online for reading practise too. There are some terrific activities in the books to do also. If you are wanting to do some work on the holidays, this is a perfect activity for you and your child to do.

MATHS HOLIDAY IDEAS

Your child can now make groups of objects from a given number eg. 8 counters – ask your child to make groups of 4 counters – how many groups are there? They can use tally marks to count a collection eg. 12 bees – ask your child to use tally marks to record the number of bees. Buy a packet of pop sticks and some rubber bands and ask your child to bundle them into tens and ones to count how many there are. Ask them to identify how many tens and how many ones. They should be able to write a number bond for this. These activities will help your child grasp a good understanding of place value.

We will continue to focus on developing the structure of narrative writing, including the use of similes, conjunctions, and expanded sentences. Throughout the term, students will also continue visiting the library and are expected to read a personal novel as part of their home reading.

MATHS

In mathematics we will be working with area and perimeter, fractions, decimals and probability. If your child still struggles with their times tables, please continue to focus on this at home.

RELIGION

General daily advertised activities are subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances, at the discretion of the service coordinator.

Medical Management Plan & Medication

All children who have been diagnosed with a medical condition including allergies, food/chemical intolerances, anaphylaxis, asthma, epilepsy will need to provide:

- A completed Medical Management Plan with a current photo
- Necessary medication

Please note it is a legal requirement under the Education & Care National Regulations and the Terms and Conditions for booking that these are provided.

In the interests of child safety, care may be refused on the day should the appropriate documentation or medication not be supplied.

Child Care Subsidy

Please note that subsidised hours are calculated and allocated by Centrelink on a fortnightly basis. Check Centrelink for eligibility.

Fortnightly childcare subsidised hours

Each session is calculated using the full service operational hours, not the hours attended by the child.

Additional Child Care subsidy will not cover any hours beyond the subsidised hours per fortnight.
