We thank you Lord, for this term. For our challenges, our successes, and the mistakes from which we have learnt.

Be with us as we spend our time with family and friends.

Give us strength and courage to do what is right: to be witnesses of our faith.

These are exciting times for education in Victoria. The Minister for Education, Ben Carroll announced the updated Victorian Teaching and Learning model, which will be implemented in all government schools across the state from 2025 with explicit teaching at its core. The Minister specifically mentioned St Mary's as a high performing school at his opening speech at the recent Age Summit. This embedding of explicit based teaching will be a game changer for our children in Victoria.

At St Marys we know this works as we have been using this approach since 2020 and our results are excellent. Our NAPLAN results for our Year 3 students in 2023 were as high as the top ten performing schools in Victoria. This is a great achievement. It is wonderful to be a leading school in education. I thank our brilliant teachers who have worked so hard for the last five years embedding this approach to teaching.

Apologies to all families as we have had a number of staff away due to personal reasons. This is understandable when children get sick, or we get sick ourselves, but it does put a strain on classes. It is not ideal, but we are doing our best to manage the disruptions. We hope next term is better for all.

Thanks to Ashley Pasqualotto for all her organisation for the school to have the opportunity to watch Inside Out 2 which had such a meaningful message around anxiety and how this emotion can at times be crippling. We will continue to unpack this concept in school and hopefully provide students with strategies to help when anxiety comes a knocking! A special thank you to the children as the behaviour was superb and was commented on favourably by the staff at the cinema.



Please be aware of PSG meetings this week. If your child has a PSG meeting, there is no need to book in a parent/teacher interview as the PSG is sufficient.

I have had questions regarding the ski program for 2024. Unfortunately the cost for the school has become significant due to the new Multi-Enterprise Agreement where teachers can no longer volunteer their support for the program but are now required to have their time paid back in lieu. This means the Saturday and the time travelling needs to be paid back to the teacher who attends the ski program. The teacher then needs to be replaced by an Emergency Teacher while time is being acquitted. This adds up significantly that cannot be passed onto the skiing families as the program would no longer be worth it. It is a huge pity that we live so close to the mountains and this great program can no longer be offered. Unfortunately the school has no control over this.

BOOK WEEK 2024



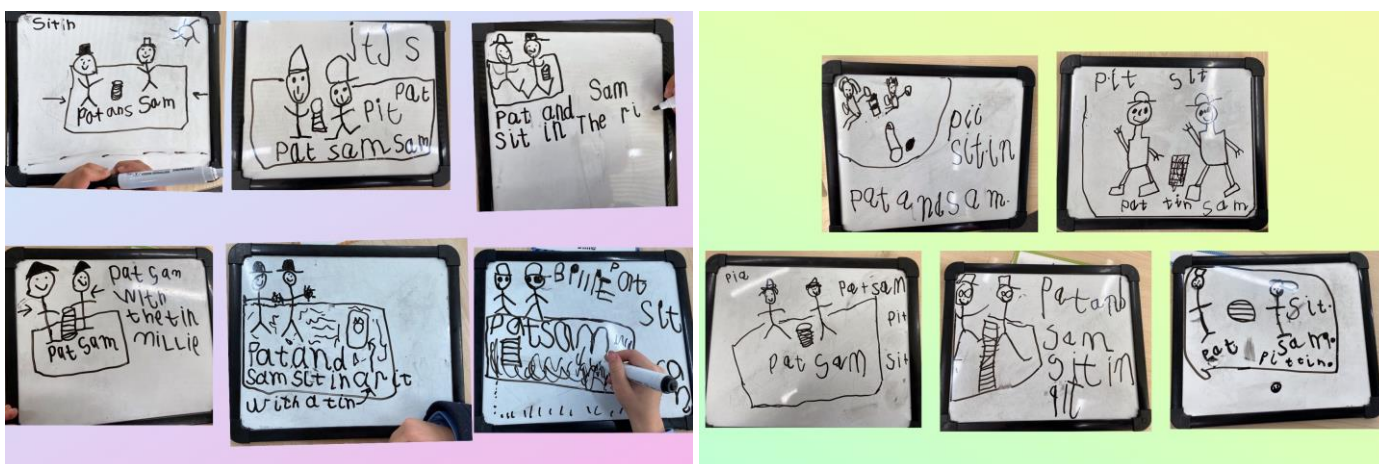
Next term in Week 4 we will be having our Book Fair to start our celebration for Book Week.

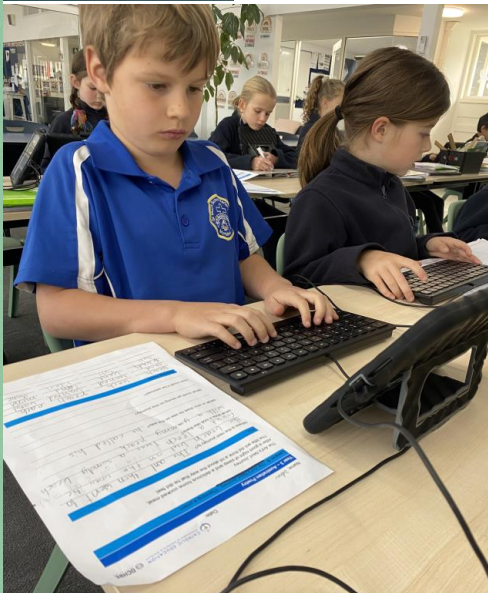
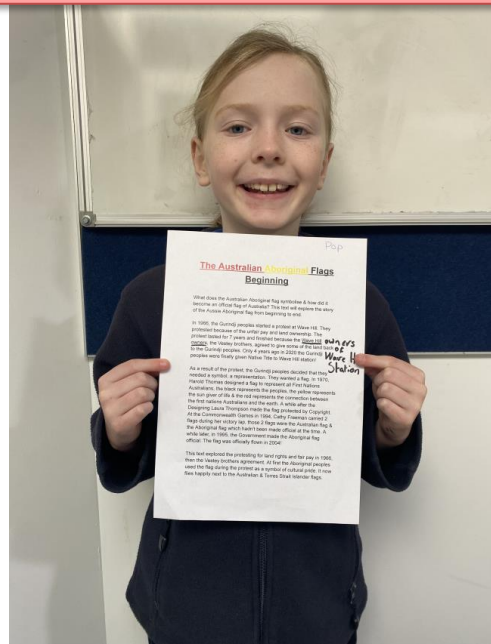


RECOUNT WRITING

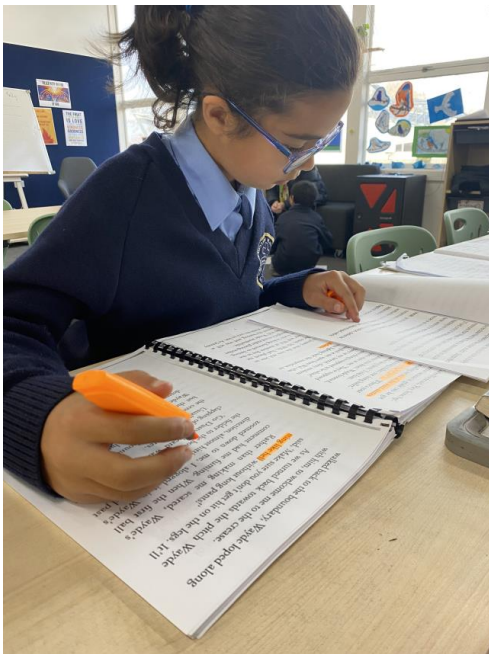

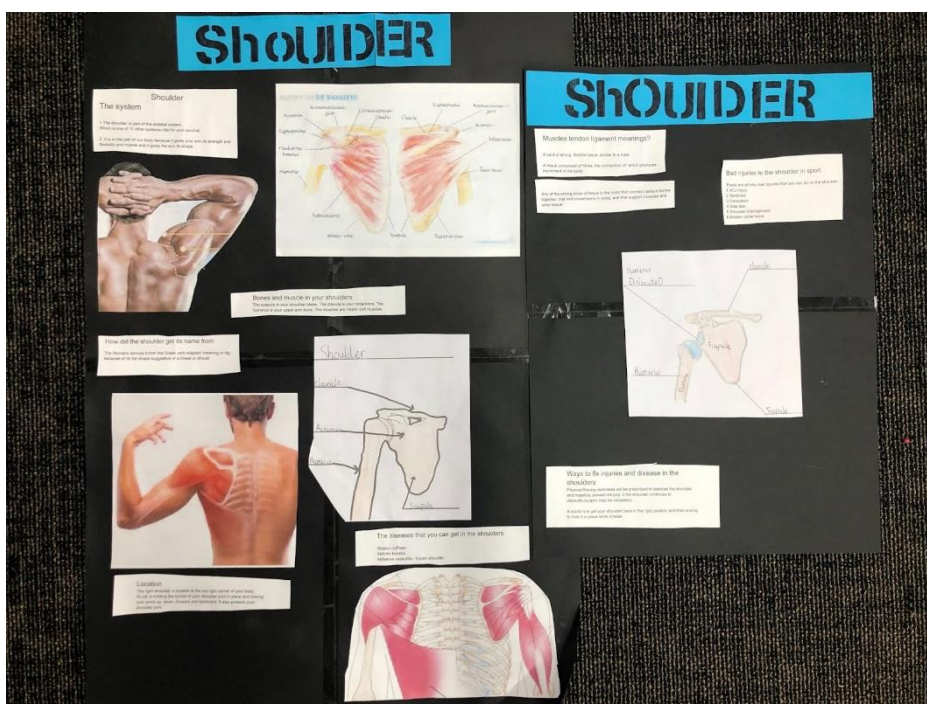
SENIOR NEWS

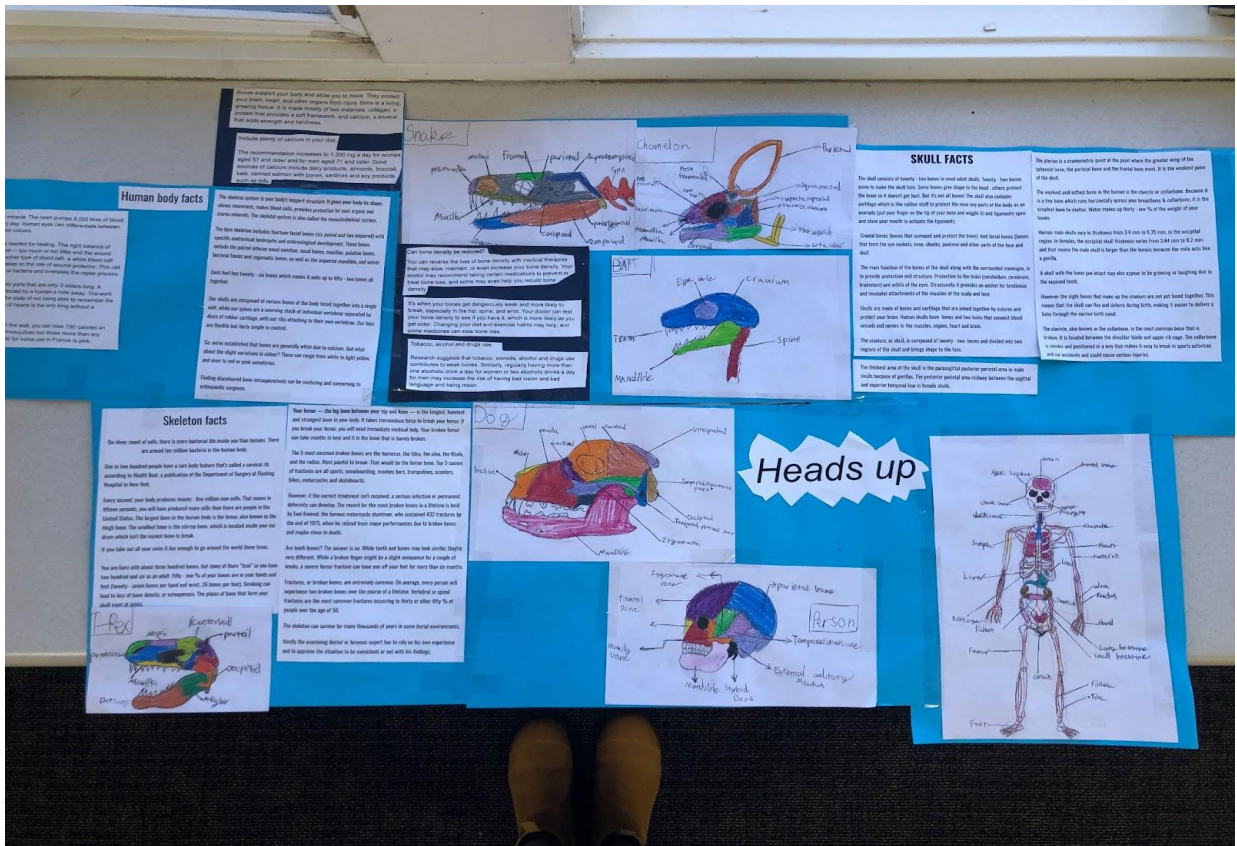

ENGLISH PROJECTS

Congratulations to the SLC students, you are producing some amazing work on your given inquiry project. They are finishing information reports using a specific structure, including hand drawn diagrams and making models to show their understanding of how body systems or parts function.





The students have studied and reviewed the novel by Michael Morpurgo, *War Horse*. From this book study they have improved their sentence structure, vocabulary through exploring new words from the text and working through paraphrasing their ideas into an engaging paragraph. 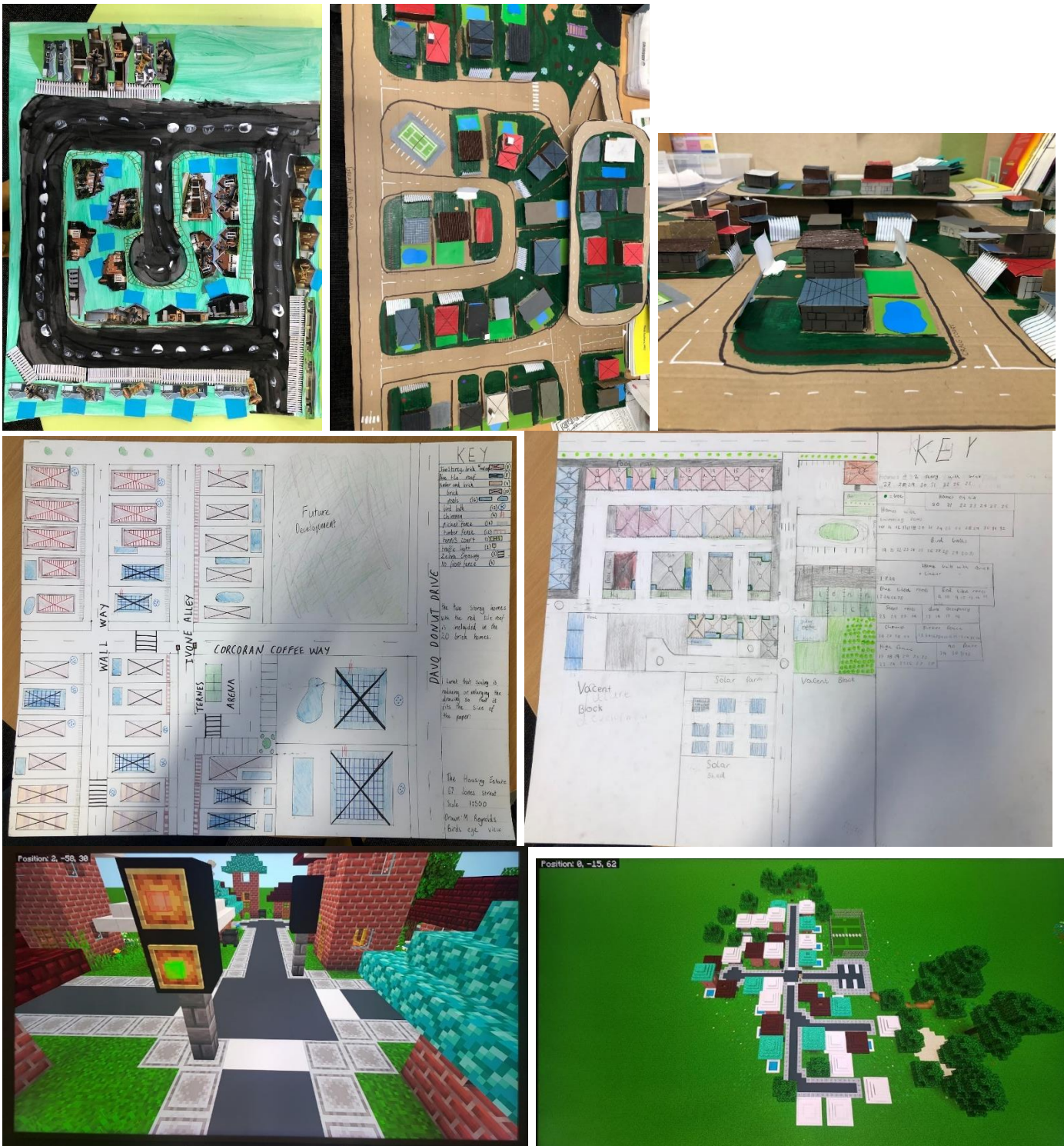

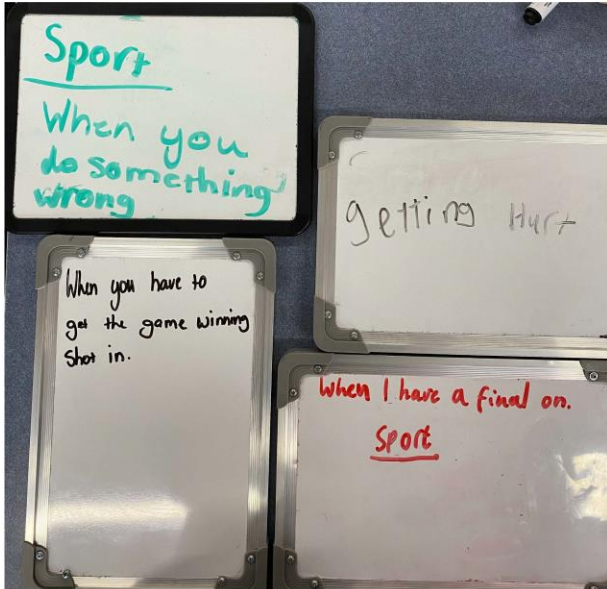




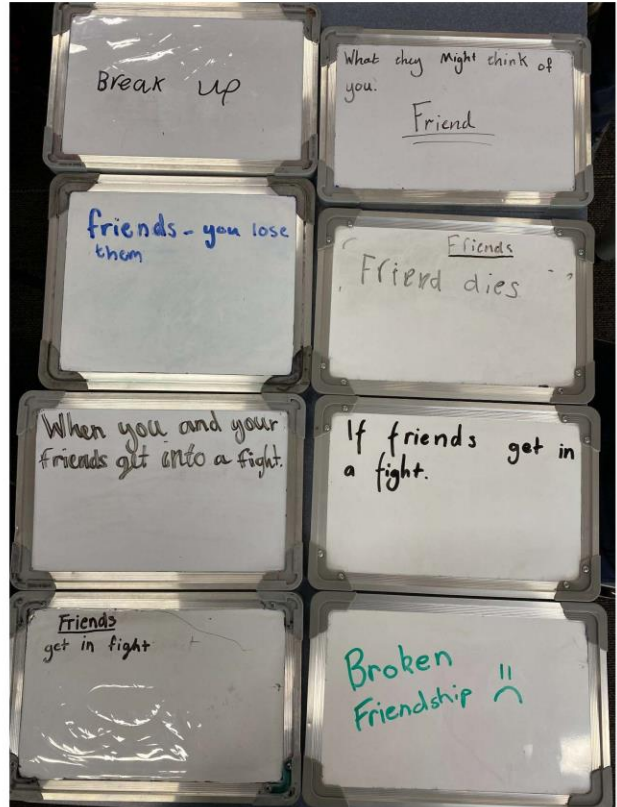
Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

In RRRR students explored the meaning of stress and identified different causes of stress that can occur at home, school, sport and in friendships. Here are some of their answers:

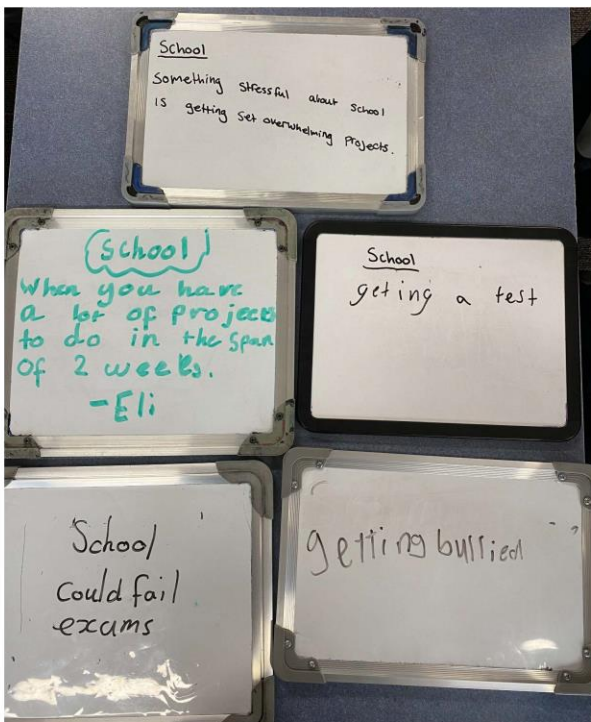

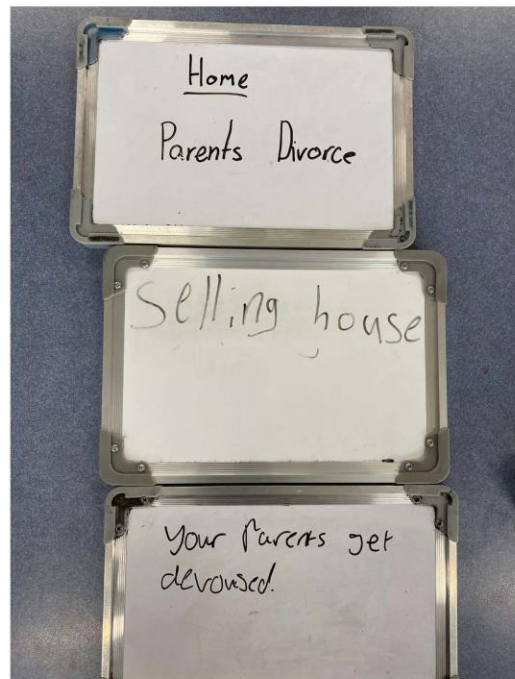
